It certainly is the case that the number three has a special significance for Freemasonry:

There are, in the basic Lodge of Freemasonry, three degrees.

There are three major officers in the basic Lodge: The Worshipful (that is, 'Respected') Master, the Senior Warden, and the Junior Warden. (These are the three officers with the gavels.)

The initiation ritual discusses both Three Greater Lights of Masonry and Three Lesser Lights of Masonry. There are three "burning tapers" arranged around the Altar that is at the center of every American Lodge room. (These may be actual tapers, but more commonly they are artfully formed stands with electric lights on top.)

The ritual mentions three "tenets" (principles) of Freemasonry.

There are three symbolic moral pillars mentioned in the ritual.

Traditionally, in older Masonic documents, the period of abbreviation is replaced by the "tripod," that is, three dots arranged in an equilateral triangle. (An enlarged example is the illustration for this post.) In fact, that's how my name appears on the cover of my new book, co-authored with Denise Sutherland (and out in early November), Cracking Codes and Cryptograms for Dummies (Wiley); when you go to the book page here, click on "Larger Image" to see how my name is printed on the cover, with tripods in the abbreviation for "Master Mason." There are other instances of the number three that appear in the ritual of the Lodge, but to discuss those would be to give too much detail. A famous 19th century Masonic author wrote, "There are ... indeed so many instances of the consecration of the number that it would exceed the limits of this volume to record them" (Albert Mackey, Lexicon of Freemasonry, entry for "Three.")

So, what is up with three? As it happens, there are a couple of different ways to answer this question, depending on where one happens to trace the origins of Freemasonry.
